Nutrition Society of Australia and Nestle Nutrition Institute Emerging Researcher Award

AWARD CRITERIA

(a) The aim of the award is to encourage first-author original research publications by NSA postgraduate student members in international journals, in the area of nutritional sciences.

(b) A candidate must:

- i) be enrolled as a full-time or part-time postgraduate student
- ii) be a financial member of the Society
- iii) be a first-time, first author who has published an original research article (excludes systematic reviews and meta analyses) since January of the previous year. The article may have been published in hard copy and/or electronic form. (Note: those who have previously published as a lead author are ineligible however those who published as a co-author are eligible to apply for this award.), and
- iv) submit a report (up to 150 words) to the NSA within four weeks of attending the conference;
- v) present at a webinar within 12 weeks of attending the conference; and
- vi) attend the NSA ASM in the year the award is offered.

(c) The award will be assessed on:

- 200 word lay summary on the potential of the recipient's work to translate into improving health (40%)
- quality of the nominated conference which the recipient will attend and statement of benefit (20%);
- research quality of the paper (20%); and
- journal ranking and journal impact in the field (20%)

(d) An applicant may only win one NSA travel award in a given year. Previous NSA Nestle Nutrition Institute Emerging Researcher Award prize winners are ineligible to apply.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

e) The Honorary Secretary (or appointed delegate) will call for applications in early February each year. Applications for the award may be submitted by 15th April by individuals who meet the criteria.

(f) The application must include the following documentation:

1. [Checklist](#) (page 4 of this document)
2. A title page, listing
 - NSA Membership Number*
 - Applicant's name*
 - Journal name*
 - Impact factor of journal*
 - NSA prizes previously won (Name & Year)*
3. a PDF copy of the nominated paper
4. 200 word statement of why the nominated paper is important in terms of nutrition research; its potential to translate into improving health; and how it is distinguished as high quality research (including impact/ranking of the journal);
5. a statement on applicants' contribution to the project and the paper;
6. the applicant's two-page CV.
7. a biography of approximately 200 words which may be used in publicity (NSA newsletter and website, and for introducing the winner at the ASM presentation of the Award).

Items 1-7 must be must be combined into **ONE PDF file with the title "yoursurname.pdf"**

OTHER INFORMATION

(g) The Awards Committee* shall evaluate the applications and submit their ranking to the Secretariat who will collate and submit the rank order to the President who will make a recommendation to NSA Council at the May NSA Council meeting, who will vote on this recommendation.

(h) The award prize will include: a certificate, a cheque for \$1,000, and complimentary registration to the NSA ASM in the year the award is offered.

(i) Only one award will be made each year. NSA gratefully acknowledges the generous financial support provided for this award by the Nestle Nutrition Research Institute. The award will be presented by the President of the Society at the Awards Ceremony at the ASM.

(j) If an applicant applies for the Nestle Award and the Early-Career Travel Award in the same year, they need to indicate which award they would prefer, as they cannot receive both awards in the same year.

** The Awards Committee for the Nestle Emerging Researcher Award shall consist of the President, President Elect, Honorary Editor, and one nominee from NSA Council together with two NSA Fellows. (The Honorary Secretary of the Society shall be a non-voting member of the Junior Awards Committee.)*
