FELLOWSHIP OF THE SOCIETY

Criteria for the Award

Fellowship of the Society may be awarded to members who have made contributions of special merit to the scientific study of nutrition and/or its applications to people and animals. Candidates must have been financial members of the Society for the five years prior to nomination.

The presentation of the award

The award is presented at the Society's ASM by the President of the Society (or his/her nominee). The award consists of a certificate, and the following benefits in relation to that ASM: a return economy airfare, accommodation for one night, free registration and free conference dinner.

The new Fellow must present a plenary lecture at the ASM.

The award includes these other benefits and expectations

The new Fellow must be available, if invited, to

- to speak at Regional Group meetings
- present a national webinar for NSA members

Fellows of the Society are exempt from paying membership fees for the rest of their lives.

Names of Fellows are published in each issue of the Proceedings.

Nomination and assessment procedures

Nominations for the award may be made by Council or by Regional Group Committees. The deadline for nominations is 15 August.

Send each nomination to Nutrition Society of Australia info@nsa.asn.au as an attachment to your email, which should have the subject line **NSA Fellow Nomination 2018 – [name of nominee]**.

The nomination must be accompanied by

- appropriate documentation (one page documenting the basis for the nomination together with the nominee's brief curriculum vitae and list of publications);
- a statement by the nominee about the impact of his/her work on the relevant area of nutrition;
- contact details of a referee (whose opinion will be sought only on the advice of the Awards Committee);
- a statement by the nominee that he/she is available to attend and present at the ASM

NSA MEDAL

Criteria for the Award

The NSA Medal may be awarded to members who are Australian nutrition scientists with an outstanding track record in the field of animal or human nutrition, with the work carried out predominantly in Australia (permanent residents are eligible to apply) and who is currently highly active in his/her field of endeavour.

Candidates must have been financial members of the Society for the five years prior to nomination.

No more than one NSA Medal shall be awarded in any one year.

The presentation of the award

The award is presented at the Society's ASM by the President of the Society (or his/her nominee).

The award consists of a certificate, and the following benefits in relation to that ASM: a return economy airfare, accommodation for one night, free registration and free conference dinner.

The new Medallist must present a plenary lecture at the ASM.

The award includes these other benefits and expectations

The new Medallist must be available, if invited, to

- to speak at Regional Group meetings
- present a national webinar for NSA members

Names of Medallists are published in each issue of the Proceedings.

Nomination and assessment procedures

Nominations for the award must be made by two members of the Society. The deadline for nominations is 15 August.

NSA MID-CAREER RESEARCHER AWARD

Criteria for the Award

The NSA Mid-career Researcher Award may be awarded to members who hold a PhD or equivalent higher degree, awarded 5 - 15 years prior to the closing date for applications, and have demonstrated excellence in any area of nutrition consistent with the aims of the Society. The candidate's contributions to the activities of the Society will also be considered. Candidates must have been financial members of the Society for the five years prior to nomination.

No more than one NSA mid - career award shall be elected in any one year.

The presentation of the award

The award is presented at the Society's ASM by the President of the Society (or his/her nominee).

The award consists of a certificate, and the following benefits in relation to that ASM: a return economy airfare, accommodation for one night, free registration and free conference dinner. The new Awardee must present a plenary lecture at the ASM.

The award includes these other benefits and expectations

The new Awardee must be available, if invited, to

- to speak at Regional Group meetings
- present a national webinar for NSA members

Names of the new Awardees are published in the Proceedings.

HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

No more than two honorary memberships may be awarded in any one year.

The award is presented at the Society's ASM by the President of the Society (or his/her nominee).

The award consists of a certificate, and the following benefits in relation to that ASM: a return economy airfare, accommodation for one night, free registration and free conference dinner.

The award includes these other benefits and expectations

Honorary members will be exempt from paying membership fees for the rest of their lives. Names of Honorary Members are published in each issue of the Proceedings.

Nomination and assessment procedures

Nominations for the award may be made by Council or by Regional Group Committees. The deadline for nominations is 15 August.

Send each nomination to Nutrition Society of Australia info@nsa.asn.au as an attachment to your email, which should have the subject line **NSA Honorary Membership Nomination 2018 – [name of nominee]**

The nomination to Council must be accompanied by appropriate documentation:

- A half page documenting the eminent service rendered to the Society.
- The Council makes its decisions about conferring this award on the advice of the relevant Awards Committee.
